

# Cancer

According to a recent survey, 70% of Americans are “very concerned” about paying for cancer treatments if diagnosed, and 59% fear they would leave their families in debt.<sup>4</sup> With cancer treatments running as high as \$5,000 a month<sup>5</sup>, it is important for you to have measures in place to ease the financial burden should the unexpected occur.

Our cancer supplement plans provide benefits, regardless of your health insurance coverage, as the result of cancer or a covered specified disease. You choose the plan that best fits your needs and the needs of your family, and benefits are paid directly to you.

Each plan provides benefits for covered inpatient confinement, inpatient or outpatient radiation, chemotherapy and blood or plasma, and inpatient or outpatient surgery and anesthesia. Additionally, benefits may be paid for covered inpatient physician visits, ambulance services, multiple forms of therapy, and medical supplies and equipment.

## Highlights of Coverage

<b>Benefit Payments</b>	Benefits are paid directly to you, the insured.
<b>Hospital Confinement</b>	Pays a daily benefit for inpatient hospital confinement due to a covered illness.
<b>Radiation, Chemotherapy and Blood and Plasma</b>	Pays charges up to a specified percent of the calendar year maximum selected for radiation, chemotherapy and blood and plasma.
<b>Surgery and Anesthesia</b>	Pays up to the selected amount for surgery. For anesthesia, pays 30% of the amount payable under the surgical benefit.
